About the Role - Primary Duties and Responsibilities

- Upgrades and modifies existing electrical distribution systems and installs new systems as required.
- Repairs, alters, installs and systematically maintains electronic and micro processor-driven systems such as fire alarm, security alarm, lighting and control system and conducts periodic testing, reporting as required.
- Installs computer network wiring.
- Installs and maintains motors, motorized equipment and associated controls, power tools, appliances and other electrical equipment.
- Installs and maintains electrical heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems and the power and control aspects of other HVAC systems.
- Designs projects, reads and interprets drawings and specifications and prepares cost estimates.
- Directs, assists and liaises with employees, contractors, regulatory agencies and other trades, as required.
- May on occasion be required to perform other related duties as assigned.

Required Qualifications and Experience

- High school graduation or the equivalent.
- Successful completion of an interprovincial Apprenticeship Program and a valid Provincial/Interprovincial Red Seal Trade Certification for Electrician.
- Two years related experience at the journeyman level.
- Ability to work with minimal supervision
- Physical capability to perform the job duties.
- Ability to read and interpret drawings and specifications.
- Valid B.C. Class 5 Driver's License.
- Competent in the use and care of tools and equipment common to this trade.
